




Total Economic Impact

SEBASTIAN MUNICIPAL AIRPORT

Sebastian Municipal Airport is located in Indian River County along Florida's Atlantic Coast, just over one mile west of downtown Sebastian. The airport has two intersecting runways, with the longest runway measuring 4,023 feet. The airport accommodates general aviation aircraft and serves a variety of general aviation activities.

The airport primarily supports recreational flying, business activities, and flight training. Skydiving is on of the most popular activity at the airport. The airport is also used for staging relief efforts after natural disasters. Local pilots offer flight and military training at the airport. A fixed based operator (FBO) at the airport supports the needs local and transient users. The airport's tenants, such as a unique fly-in golf course, contribute to its economic impacts.

Florida's Statewide Benefits From Aviation

Florida realizes significant economic benefits from aviation. The Florida Department of Transportation completed a comprehensive economic impact analysis to measure these benefits. Benefits measured in the FDOT study considered on-airport impacts, visitor spending impacts, and multiplier impacts.

Florida's 129 public-use airports (including 20 commercial service facilities) are a major economic engine of the State's economy. The aviation system keeps Florida connected to the global marketplace while simultaneously driving local economies. Florida's airports provide space and infrastructure for important activities such as manufacturing, logistics, tourism, and emergency response. Below is a summary of the total statewide economic impact as well as the impact of District 4.
