


The following graphic is an example of how activity at Florida airports generates economic impacts throughout the state.




## THE ECONOMIC IMPACT OF Jacksonville International Airport (JAX)



## JACKSONVILLE INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

Jacksonville International Airport is located in Duval County, approximately 14 miles north of downtown Jacksonville. The airport has two runways, with the longest runway measuring 10,000 feet, allowing it to accommodate a full range of commercial aircraft.

Jacksonville International Airport supports a mix of personal, leisure, and business-related travel. The airport serves as a gateway for visitors whose spending helps to contribute to the airport and surrounding region's economic impact. The airport also supports freight and cargo activity, with FedEx and UPS maintaining local distribution centers on-site. The airport accommodates a significant amount of corporate and business flying from major regional employers such as the CSX Corporation and Fidelity National Financial. The Florida Air National Guard maintains a base at the airport, where they conduct daily military operations. The airport is engaged in the community, offering educational tours and as well as an internship program through local colleges. The airport has approximately 60 aviation-related tenants that contribute to its economic impact.





## Florida's Statewide Benefits From Aviation

Florida realizes significant economic benefits from aviation. The Florida Department of Transportation completed a comprehensive economic impact analysis to measure these benefits. Benefits measured in the FDOT study considered on-airport impacts, visitor spending impacts, and multiplier impacts.

Florida's 129 public-use airports (including 20 commercial service facilities) are a major economic engine of the State's economy. The aviation system keeps Florida connected to the global marketplace while simultaneously driving local economies. Florida's airports provide space and infrastructure for important activities such as manufacturing, logistics, tourism, and emergency response. Below is a summary of the total statewide economic impact as well as the impact of District 2.
