


FERGUSON AIRPORT

Ferguson Airport is located in Escambia County along Florida's Gulf Coast, about eight miles west of downtown Pensacola. The airport is conveniently located close to beaches, golf, fishing, and Pensacola's downtown. The airport has one runway, measuring 3,200 feet. The airport accommodates small general aviation aircraft and serves a variety of general aviation activities.

The airport primarily supports flight trainings such as fixed wing, tail wheel, and aerobatic training. The Civil Air Patrol conducts flights for school children and the airport hosts an annual Fly-In to promote aviation. A local Experimental Aircraft Association (EAA) chapter holds monthly breakfasts at the airport. The airport also occasionally acts as a staging area for other community events such as career day and

community meetings. Tenants at the airport include a fixed based operator (FBO) and an aircraft maintenance repair shop to serve users' needs.

Florida's Statewide Benefits From Aviation

Florida realizes significant economic benefits from aviation. The Florida Department of Transportation completed a comprehensive economic impact analysis to measure these benefits. Benefits measured in the FDOT study considered on-airport impacts, visitor spending impacts, and multiplier impacts.

Florida's 129 public-use airports (including 20 commercial service facilities) are a major economic engine of the State's economy. The aviation system keeps Florida connected to the global marketplace while simultaneously driving local economies. Florida's airports provide space and infrastructure for important activities such as manufacturing, logistics, tourism, and emergency response. Below is a summary of the total statewide economic impact as well as the impact of District 3.
